

# **Houston, Texas – Reunion Tours**

#### Tour #1 - Wednesday October 2, 2024, Galveston Moody Gardens Rainforest

(Approximately 1 hour 16 minutes bus trip each way.) **Lunch included - Cost is \$86 per person.**As you enter through a tree-top canopy entrance, you'll visit the rainforests of Asia, Africa and the Americas in a rare, up-close and interactive adventure with over 1,700 exotic plants and endangered animals that encourage the use of sight, sound and smell to experience the Rainforest life 24 hours a day through climatic changes. (No, it's not going to rain on you). The Giant River Otters are an outside display recreating the Amazon River Rainforest but inside a huge glass pyramid is a 90 minute experience that includes Saki monkeys, Cotton-top Tamarins and Sloths that roam freely while Komodo dragons and other reptiles roam beneath an array of birds that fly between the trees as you walk the trails through this spacious enclosure. Don't be surprised if you come around a corner to find a bird standing in the walkway staring at you but you will have to work hard to see the sloths, they blend in and don't move much in the tree. – HINT Look for lumps where they shouldn't be. This tour will include a buffet lunch in the Garden Restaurant that overlooks Offatts Bayou where you will be cruising for 45 minutes in an 1800's reconstruction of a shallow draft paddle wheel boat with a narrated tour description of the highlights of bayou animal life and its importance in the South Texas history. (Think John Lafitte the Pirate). Later you will drive to the sea wall, stop for a photo opportunity, and drive up the Galveston Strand to a stop at LaKings Confectionary where you can purchase old fashioned sodas, malts or candy like taffy or fudge for the ride back to the hotel.





#### Tour #2 - Thursday, October 3, 2024, Houston Space Center


(Approximately 45-minute bus trip each way.) **Lunch is on your own- Cost is \$58 per person.**Houston Space Center is a science museum that serves as the official visitor center of NASA Johnson Space Center in Houston, Texas. It was designated a Smithsonian Affiliate Museum in 2014. Tours are your chance to go on-site at NASA Johnson Space Center and get an up-close look at human space exploration. Located on 1,600 acres, NASA Johnson Space Center is the training base for NASA astronauts and the site of Mission Control, where a Houston-based team supports the work of our women and men in space. This tour includes both the former Space Control Center and the 90-minute tram tour to the Launch area. Lunch is available in a variety of food court experiences, including sandwiches, salads, and gourmet main entrees. Exotic and custom coffee and tea drinks as well as soda and water are available.

#### Tour #3 – Friday, October 4, 2024, George Ranch Historical Park

(Approximately 1 hour bus trip each way.) Lunch included – Cost is \$79 per person.

The tour day starts with a photo stop at an urban multi waterfall. From there we continue to the George Ranch founded in 1824 just outside of Houston. The Ranch included five separate generations (1830's 1860's, 1890's and 1930's) of homes and ranch outbuildings connected for you by trams. Each home has docents in costumes consistent to the time period who will point out the homes highlight and what challenges the ranch faced good and bad from the period. The highlight of the day will be a 40-minute-long horned cattle demonstration of roping and running the cattle through dip tanks. Make sure your phone has plenty of power or bring a camera. A herd of long horned cattle is a sight to remember.





#### Tour #4 – Saturday, October 5, 2024, The Museum of Natural Science

(Approximately 30-minute bus trip each way) Lunch is on your own - Cost is between \$59 and \$61 per person. This day you have three choices Tour 4A Entrance to the Museum Permanent exhibits plus a walk-through visit to the Cockrell Butterfly Experience which is 1500 live butterflies in a walk through visited. Price \$61.00, Tour 4B Entrance to permanent exhibits plus as Planetarium show and a variety of planet and star issues \$59.00 or Tour 4C Entrance to permanent exhibits plus Giant Theater Access. (think I Max theater) \$62.00. The Houston Museum of Natural Science has about 20 different Permanent exhibits plus special exhibits. Here are some of the favorites. The Weiss Energy Hall which transports you to a 21 century Offshore oil well, the Hall of Paleontology this has the bones of dinosaurs of other creature in day-to-day life or death struggle, the Gem and Minerals Hall which has 450 different crystals, gems, and rock (like Moon Rocks). This Hall also has the Everyday Faberge exhibit which has the largest display in the US of Faberge moving clocks and eggs. Absolutely amazing. The Parish Hall of Texas Wildlife and the Graham Hall of African Wildlife. Like King Tut? There's a great display of life on the Nile including an interactive descent into King Tuts tomb. Lots to see and limited time to take a stab at what appeals to you. Please note these add on experiences have assigned times which will be arranged around your lunch on your own. The food service is on your own at Periodic Table or Elements Grill. The food available includes salad, sandwiches, breakfast, coffee, tea, and snacks. Add on experience are not moveable or if you fail to show refundable as these are highly discounted group benefits. You may add more experience at your own cost and at general admission prices if time slots are available. We will be leaving at 2:30 for a 3:00 PM hotel arrival, with plenty of time to get ready for the banquet in the evening.

# Veterans exposed to toxins and other hazards are NOW eligible for VA Health Care

All veterans exposed to toxins and other hazards during military service, whether at home, overseas, or deployed, are now eligible for VA Health Care.

At the direction of the President, the VA is expanding health care eligibility to millions of veterans including all who served in the Vietnam War, Gulf War, Iraq and/or Afghanistan, or any other combat zone after 9/11, which is years earlier that what's called for by the PACT Act.

These veterans will be eligible to direct enroll in VA Health Care without applying first for VA Benefits.

Also, veterans who never deployed but were exposed to toxins or other hazards while training or on active duty in the U.S. will also be eligible for enrollment in the VA Health Care System.

The expansion of VA Health Care eliminates the phased-in approach that was included in the PACT Act, to millions of veterans who are now eligible for VA health care up to eight years earlier than what was in the law.

It's is now going to be faster and easier for millions of veterans to enroll into the VA Heath Care System.

Many veterans believe they have to apply for VA Service Connected Disability Compensation Benefits before they're eligible for VA Health Care. This is incorrect with this expansion. Millions of eligible veterans can directly enroll in VA Care without first applying for VA Benefits.

The current VA Health Care System is for veterans and will treat their patients just like any civilian medical facility, however, if you travel out of your area, the civilian medical facilities cannot view your medical records.

Now, with the improved VA Health Care System they can access your medical records and see if there is any concerning medical conditions.

# VA announces steps to increase screening and benefit Access for Veterans with Cancer

VA just announced several critical new steps to expand preventative services, health care and benefits for veterans with cancer as part of the "Biden Cancer Moonshot".

In the next 90 days, the VA will be making urethral cancers presumptive for service connection for eligible Gulf War and Post 9/11 veterans. That means that Gulf War and Post 9/11 veterans who deployed to Iraq, Afghanistan, Somalia, Dijibuti, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Yeman, Uzbeckistan and the Southwest Asia theater of operations in its entirety, won't have to prove their service caused their urethral cancer to receive benefits for it. Instead, the VA will automatically assume service connection for the disease, providing benefits to veterans who submit claims.

In the next 3 months Urethral Cancers are set to be added to the list of 300 plus conditions that are considered presumptive under the PACT Act, along with many other cancers.

The VA is starting the process to formally evaluate Urinary, Bladder and Ureteral Cancers for presumption of service connection for eligible Gulf War and Post 9/11 veterans. Over the coming months , the VA will evaluate if there is a relationship between Urinary, Bladder and Ureteral Cancers and Toxic Exposures.

The VA will then determine if these conditions become presumptive conditions for veterans who served in those locations and time periods. The VA is expanding access to Genetic, Lung and Colorectal Cancer Screening for veterans. By the end of the year, the VA plans to offer genetic testing to every veteran who needs it. This will help the VA understand, treat and cure some patients with cancer by reading the code in their DNA.

The VA will also bring a Lung Cancer screening program to every VA Medical Facility, helping to save the lives of the nearly 5,000 veterans who die from Lung Cancer every year.

Colorectal Screening are being expanded, with colorectal Cancer being the second leading cause of cancer deaths in America. It will be providing more than one million veterans throughout the country with tests that can be completed at home.

The VA continues to expand the reach of smoking cessation services to veterans across the nation. As the 1-855-QUIT-VET tobacco quitline and the SmokefreeVET Test Message program pass their 10 year anniversaries of service, the VA says it will add at least six additional sites to the Quit-VET eReferral Program by the end of 2024.

This will expand the capacity to offer veteran-specific tailored tobaccouse treatment to veterans.

Additionally, the VA recently launched a new pilot program to integrate smoking cessation services into into the Lung Cancer Screening in recognition of the inherent connection between smoking and lung cancer risk – and the plans to add at least five additional sites by the end of 2025.

"Cancer impacts far too many veterans every year, and under President Biden's Leadership of the Cancer Moonshot, we are fighting to end caner as we know it" said VA Secretary Dennis McDonough.

These steps will help save lives and provide the world-class health care and benefits that our veterans so rightly deserve.
